2. **Alexander<sup>2</sup> Dennett** (*John<sup>1</sup>*) born Abt. 1630 in Hurst Pierpoint, Sussex, England, and died Abt. 1698 in Portsmouth, Rockingham Co., New Hampshire. Alexander settled in New Castle, New Hampshire about 1668/69 and his brother settled in Portsmouth. He was a blacksmith by trade and no doubt prospered well, as when he died his inventory consisted of up to 50 pounds-7 shillings: a house and land - 30 pounds; cash, 10 pounds-7 shillings; two and a half bushels of barley - 10 shillings; 4660 shingles - 2 pounds-16 shillings; two plates, two platters and two porringers - 11 shillings; a parsell of iron wear - 2 pounds-15 shillings-6 pence; a small parsell of feathers - 6 shillings; 3 shirts - 12 shillings; a parsell of woolen close - 2 pounds-10 shillings; a payer of shuse, one hat and four caps - 6 shillings; one chest - 3 shillings; one payer of woolen stockings - 2 shillings; one towel and two neck cloths - 1 shilling; D iron square - 1 shilling. The inventory was made by John Dennett, probably his brother.

7. **Alexander<sup>3</sup> Dennett** (*Alexander<sup>2</sup>, John<sup>1</sup>*) born Abt. 1664 in Hurst Pierpoint, Sussex, England, and died 07 Jun 1733 in Portsmouth, New Hampshire. He married **(1) Mehitable Tetherly** in Portsmouth, New Hampshire, daughter of Gabriel Tetherly and Susanna King. She was born Abt. 1663 in Kittery, Me, and died in Old Kittery, Maine. **(2) Esther Mason** 02 Dec 1728. Alexander Jr. enlisted and served in the garrison at Oyster Bay in 1696. He was also a member of Colonel Vaughan's regiment in the French War in 1712. He was taxed 4% on property in 1681 and 1682. In 1696 he was elected surveyor of highways and at various times had land conveyed to him. He left quite a large property which he divided amongst his children, but gave the largest to his son, Moses. Alexander was constable of Kittery, Maine in the years 1684 to 1686. He also served on the Grand Jury in Maine in the years 1689, 1690, 1692 and 1693. He was on the Grand Jury in New Hampshire in 1697.

### Abraham's Last Will and Testament

Item 1: I give to my son Moses Dennett all in land excepting ye westerly end of my house at ye bank which shall be expressed herein hereafter and my will is that my son, Moses, maintain his brother Samuel during his lifetime unless it shall please God to return his reason and yet then my son, Moses, pay him 100 pounds and be quit of maintaining him. Also I give to my son, Moses, my household goods and also my husbandry and carpenter tools for his own use and all my real estate to be given to said son, Moses, to have and to hold to him, his heirs and assigns forever.

Item 2: I give to my daughter, Susannah, ye west end of my house at ye bank with ye west end of my land, belonging that I have not sold to John James, to be to her and her heirs.

Item 3: I give to my son, Ebenezer; my daughter Mehitable Hart; my daughter Elizabeth Sanborn and my daughter Sarah Weymouth to each one, one shilling, to be paid them by my son Moses. I having advanced them out of my estate already.

He married **Abigail Hill** 10 Jun 1714, daughter of Samuel Hill and Elizabeth Williams. She was born 29 Sep 1687 in Portsmouth, New Hampshire, and died Aft. Dec 1759 in Maine.

#### Division of Ebenezer Dennett's Estate

Whereas we the subscribers, being appointed by the Honorable Jeremiah Moulten, Esq., Judge of Probate of Wills and for the County of York. To make distribution of the real estate of Ebenezer Dennet, late of Kittery in said County, deceased. Intestate, to and amongst the widow and children of said deceased, and we have viewed the estate and made distribution thereof, in the following manner, Viz:

We have set off to Abigail Dennet, widow of said deceased for her third part of said estate, thirteen poles in westerly from the highway on the southerly side of the home far, the whole length of said farm excepting in that part which is set off to Abigail Clark, in which part it is to be ten poles wid. Also the westerly end of the dwelling house, lower room chamber and cellar. Also, one third of the bar and the easterly end, which is in full for her said third of the estate.

We have set off to Samuel Dennet, eldest son of said deceased, about eleven acres and three quarters of an acre of land, part of the home farm bounded, Viz. Beginning at the southeast corner of said farm by the highway; thence westerly by said way forty-eight poles; thence north twenty-seven degrees west across the lot to Benjamin Hills' land; thence north easterly by said Hills' land to lands belonging to the heirs of Nicholas Shapleigh Junior, deceased; thence by said Shapleigh's land to the first beginning. Also the dwelling house and barn, which is on said land (only the widow to have her third, during her life in the house, barn and land, left to her as above), which is in full for his double share of said estate.

We have set off to John Dennet, about twelve acres of land next to the land set off to Samuel, beginning at the southwest corner of said Samuel's by the highway; thence westerly, by said way thirty-five poles; thence north forty degrees west to Benjamin Hills' land; thence north easterly as said Hills' land to the aforesaid, Samuel Dennet's; thence by said Samuel to the first beginning, which thirteen acres of land is in full for his own share. Also is in full for twenty pounds, lawfull money value which the said John purchased of three of his sisters, namely Elizabeth Jenkins, Abigail Clark and Susanna Dennet. The said John to allow the widow her third during her life as is set off to her.

We have set off to Elizabeth Jenkins, about three acres of land part of the home farm, next to that part which set off to John Dennet, and is ten poles in breadth by the highway and carries that breadth to Benjamin Hills' land. Also twelve acres and quarter of land at Rocky Hill in Kittery, which the said Ebenezer Dennet, deceased, purchased of Eleazer Ferguson, which is in full for her share of said estate with what she acknowledges to have received of her father in his lifetime. Also, to have the value of six pounds, thirteen shillings and four pence for her part of interest in said estate, which she conveyed to her brother John Dennet as appears by an instrument under her hand and seal on the said Elizabeth to allow the widow her third, during life as is left off to her.

We have set off to Susanna Dennett, about fourteen acres and quarter of land part of the home farm. Beginning at the southwest corner of that part set off to Elizabeth Jenkins by the highway; thence southwesterly by said way forty-nine poles; thence north forty-three degrees west to the southwest corner of Benjamin Hills' land; thence northeasterly by said Hills' land to the aforesaid Elizabeth Jenkins' land; thence by said Jenkins to the first beginning; which is in full for her share of said estate, with what she received of her father in his lifetime. Also, the value of six pounds, thirteen shillings, and four pence for part of her interest in said estate, which she conveyed to her brother John Dennet as appears by an instrument under her hand and seal. The said Susanna to allow the widow her third, as it is set off to her during said Widow's life.

We have set off to Mehitable Pilsbury, about twelve acres of land beginning by the highway at the southwest corner of that part set off to Susannah; thence by said way southwesterly thirty-seven poles; thence north forty degrees west to the road that goes to Morrell's Ferry; thence by said road to Joseph Pilsbury's land; thence easterly by said Pilsbury's land to Benjamin Hills' land; thence south easterly by said Hills' land and by the land set off to Susanna to the highway at the first beginning, which is in full with what she acknowledges to have received of her

father in his lifetime for her share of said estate, she allowing the widow her third during her life as is let off to her.

We have set off to Abigail Clark, about nine acres of land part of the home farm and is all the land lying between the land set off to Mehitabel Pillsbury and the road leading to Morrell's Ferry and is the westerly part of the home farm commonly known by the name of the old field, which is with what she acknowledges to have received of her father in his lifetime. Also the value of six pounds, thirteen shillings and four pence, part of her interest which she sold to her brother, John Dennet, which is in full for her share of said estate, the said Abigail Clark, to allow, the widow her third, as is set off to her during her life.

We having viewed a hundred acres of land lying in Berwick, which the deceased gave by deed of gift to his son, Ebenezer Dennett, Junior, which we judge to be in full for his share of said deceased estate.

Ebenezer was a tanner by trade and his property divided by order of the court in 1760. His estate was on "Toad Lane" in Kittery, Maine. He had a 100 acre farm given to him by his father.

**30. Joseph<sup>6</sup> Dennett** (*John<sup>5</sup>, Ebenezer<sup>4</sup>, Alexander<sup>3</sup>, Alexander<sup>2</sup>, John<sup>1</sup>*) born 30 May 1755 in Maine, and died 23 Jun 1839 in Lyman, York Co., Maine. He married **Sarah "Sally" Wakefield** 04 Mar 1781 in Wells, York Co., Maine, daughter of James Wakefield and Miriam Burbank. She was born 29 Mar 1763 in Maine, and died 31 Oct 1846. Joseph enlisted in Capt. Jesse Dormann's company, Col. Scammon's Regiment of the Massachusetts Line in May 1775. The regiment marched to Cambridge, Massachusetts, and was stationed at Bunker Hill. The regiment was sent to the Battle of Bunker Hill, but because of conflicting orders and the chaos that ensued from other American troops retreating, Col. Scammon retreated with his troops and afterwards was called a coward and court marshaled. The evidence showed Scammon was not a coward, but lack of trust from officers under his leadership caused him to relinquish his command. Joseph served eight months and was discharged in December 1775, and re-enlisted in Col. Finney's Regiment in Jan 1776, Capt. Silas Wilde's company of the Massachusetts Militia and was sent to Ticonderoga, New York, serving one year. In May 1777, he re-enlisted in York, Maine in Capt. York's company for six months and served out his time. The regiment marched to Providence, Rhode Island. At Joseph's pension hearing, his brother Samuel and sisters Abigail and Anna testified to his service.

Sworn to and subscribed, the day and year aforesaid Before Asher Ware, U.S. Judge for the District of Maine I, Samuel Dennet of Lyman, in the county of York and state of Maine, aged sixty-six years, testify and declare that I am acquainted with Joseph Dennet of said Lyman, a revolutionary pensioner, said Joseph is my brother. I resided with him in my Father's family when he entered the army in the Revolutionary War. About the second year of the war I recollect very well that my said brother Joseph enlisted with the army and went to Providence in Rhode Island. My full impression is that he went away in April 1777 and I think that he returned home in October following. I know we had finished digging our potatoes that year when he returned home. I well remember that he was sick with the measles at this time, which was communicated to the rest of our family. I have not the least doubt he served at

Providence, the whole of that summer. I do understand it at the time and never heard it contradicted.

State of Maine, York, Aug. 7<sup>th</sup>, 1832, subscribed and sworn to before me Bern Palmer, Justice of the Peace I, Abigail Mildram, of Wells in the Co. of York State of Maine, widow, aged sixty-eight years, and I, Anna Clark, wife of Nathan Clark, Esq., of Wells, aforesaid, aged sixty-three, certify and declare, that we are the sisters of Joseph Dennet, of Lyman, and well remember that our said brother, Joseph enlisted, three times, in the service of the United States during the Revolution, and we well remember, that the said Joseph enlisted the third time much against the will of our family; also that our father assisted him and our brother John, who went with him (but never returned) in carrying their baggage so far as Kittery, Maine. We also certify that then went away one winter and returned the winter following. We understood from him, and from our parents that he was in the army that season at Providence, Rhode Island. We also remember that our father brought him home sick.

Joseph and Sally Wakefield Dennett; Peter and Abigail Wakefield Roberts; and John and Elizabeth Durrell Wakefield had adjoining farms near Robert's Corner in Lyman, Maine. According to his 1829 pension request he owned about 60 acres and an unfinished house in Lyman, Maine.

### **Joseph Dennett's Last Will and Testament**

In the Name of God, Amen. I, Joseph Dennet, Lyman, in the County of York and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, yeoman in Consideration of the uncertainty of this mortal life and being of a sound mind and memory, and blessed be Almighty God for the same, I do make, publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say all my honest debts shall be paid by my executors hereafter named out of my personal estate.

2ly. I will and bequeath to my beloved wife, Sarah Dennett, her third of all my real and personal estate during her remaining my widow. But if she marries for at the close of her life to return to my Executor. Also I give to her my household furniture at her own disposal.

3ly. I will and bequeath to my son Joseph Dennet, my homestead farm, with ten acres of land bought of Gideon Hanscom, also two days in at sawmill with all my personal estate with paying out the said legatees hereafter named.

4ly. I will and bequeath to my son Ammi Dennet a certain tract of land being in Hollis, in the County and Commonwealth aforesaid and Robert Cleaves, if he lives to the age of twenty-one years and serves his time out with my Executor.

5ly. I will one dollar to my son John Dennet, at my decease, be paid him by my Executor, hereafter named.

6ly. I will and bequeath to my son Charles (probably Asa) Dennet, one dollar to be paid him by my Executor, hereafter named.

7ly. I will and bequeath to my son Joshua Dennet, one dollar to as above.

8ly. I will and bequeath to my son Jesse Dennet, one dollar to be paid as or have.

9ly. I will and bequeath to my son Simon Dennet, five hundred dollars to be paid him at the age of twenty-one and two good handsome suits of cloth(e)s to be paid by my Executor, he serving his time with him.

10ly. I will and bequeath to my daughter Aphia Dennet, a back bedroome in my house with a fine in it so long as she remains single, also one hundred dollars to be paid by my Executor when she is of the age of eighteen years in furniture and stock.

Lastly, as to all the rest of my personal estate, goods, and chattels of kind or nature I give and bequeath to my son Joseph Dennet, whom I hereby appoint my sole Executor of this my Last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former Wills by me made in witness whereof. I have hereunto let my hand and seal this second day of June One thousand Eight hundred and Nineteen.

Dennett. — Oren Dennett, for twenty-five years one of the best known ice men on the Hudson River, died at his late residence, 12 East Sixty-eighth street, on October 30. The funeral was held on the following Monday and was attended by a great many of his friends, including old time ice men. The burial was in Woodlawn. Mr. Dennett was born at Saco, Maine, August 24, 1824, which would make him at the time of his death 84 years old. He started in the ice business as a foreman in 1850, having charge of the 8 wagons which loaded at the foot of Duane street, North River, and delivered ice daily to Brooklyn and the then City of New York. These were the only wagons operated by the Knickerbocker Ice Company delivering ice at that time in those cities. A few years later he was made one of the superintendents of this company, his district extending north to West Camp on the Hudson, with winter headquarters at Rondout. He served in that capacity and as a director until 1896 when the company was absorbed by the Consolidated Ice Company, after which his time was devoted to the New Jersey Ice Company in which he had been interested for many years.

#### **Natural Ice Notes Oren Dennett**

Some additional details of the interesting career of Oren Dennett are given below. Mr. Dennett had many warm friends in the ice business, but he was very reticent concerning his own affairs, and it has been difficult to obtain any adequate account of his life. The photograph reproduced is an enlargement from a flash light taken at a dinner a few years ago; no other likeness of Mr. Dennett had been taken in many years. He was eighty-four years of age, and being of a sturdy New England stock, had scarcely known a sick day. Mr. Dennett was born in Biddeford, Me., the son of John and Lydia Dennett, and was one of a family of thirteen children. His grandfather was John Locke, the famous English mathematician, original manuscripts of whose works are now on exhibition in the British Museum. When eighteen years of age Mr. Dennett surrendered the slow opportunities of farm life and, leaving home, came to New York city. There he entered the employ of the Knickerbocker Ice Company as driver of an ice wagon. Later his activity and good business judgment became so apparent and useful that he was advanced step by step, thus reaching the confidential position of comptroller and adviser, and was for years close to the company's well-known president, W. H. Barmore. Much credit may be given him for the subsequent success of the company. Upon the consolidation of the Knickerbocker and other ice companies under the name of the American Ice Securities Company, he became a director. Besides being a potent factor in this company, he was a director and influential in the affairs of the New Jersey Ice Company. Mr. Dennett had lived to a ripe age and made many friends who were warmly attached to him. He was a man of strong character, with a genial yet forceful disposition; was able to select men adapted to their respective avocations, was assiduous in attention to his duties, and exacted the same honest consideration from those in his charge. His insight in business was sharp and really phenomenal. His accomplishments have been productive of success only, and round out the fullest measure of a complete life. He is survived by a widow.

The connection is unknown because of the dates of birth of both men makes it difficult to determine the relationship. William was granted a tract of land from Harlaakanden Symonds, of Ipswich, measuring six miles by four miles on 12 Jun 1688 adjoining Wells and Cape Porpoise, Maine, called Cokshall. The land owned by Cleaves became the town of Lyman, Maine. William lived in Beverly, Massachusetts, where Cleaves descendants lived for several generations. William married Martha Corey, and after her death, her sister Margaret, who were the daughters of Giles Corey.

Giles was an innocent victim of the Reverend Cotton Mather and fellow persecutors during the Salem witchcraft trials. He was a watchman, born in England in 1617 and was married twice, (1) Margaret, the mother of his children, and (2) Mary, migrated from Virginia, who was also prosecuted and condemned like her husband Giles. Giles sentence of death was placing stones on top of him until he was crushed; and Mary was hanged a few days later. The Arthur Miller play, *The Crucible's* central characters were based on Giles and Mary, but the events surrounding their trial was not accurate.

**Transfusion Saves Doctor – G. R. Lockwood, Noted Specialist, Receives Blood from Lounger in Park—His Improvement Rapid – He Is Suffering from Ulcer of Stomach – Attended Many Prominent Men**

New York. June 27.—Dr. George. R. Lockwood, one of the greatest stomach specialist in the country and himself a sufferer from an ulcer of the stomach, was saved from death early yesterday by having transfused into his veins the blood of a "park bencher." Because of a severe hemorrhage his life was ebbing rapidly. The nurse and the physician in attendance telephoned for surgeons, and after a hurried consultation it was decided the blood of a healthy man was necessary to give the patient strength. Calls for other surgeons followed and a hunt was made for men willing to sell their blood. Hospitals were tried in vain for available men. Attendants were sent scurrying to the homes of persons who had offered to sell their blood, but none of them was at home.

Finally distinguished physicians went to Central Park and they importuned loungers whom they found to help save the life of a man who had devoted his life to alleviating the suffering of others. The offer of \$50 in cash proved tempting to the men who had not the price of a bed or a breakfast, and several of them were taken in a taxicab to the home of Dr. Lockwood, 18 East 52<sup>nd</sup> street. One man was selected. The transfusion was performed and afterward it was said Dr. Lockwood was much stronger and probably will recover. Whether the ulcer will heal of itself or an operation must be performed on the stomach remains to be decided. Transfusion in such cases is resorted to for the purpose either of building the patient up or of giving him sufficient strength to undergo an operation.

Dr. Lockwood has a reputation throughout the country as a specialist in stomach diseases. He was called in consultation in the case of Grover Cleveland, who had a form of cancer, an attended him for many months. He has prescribed for the most eminent men in the country. His skill lay in diagnosing cases and advising as to methods of treatment, but he never operated on his patients. After being graduated from the College of Physicians and Surgeons in 1884 he devoted his attention to stomach diseases. He for a time was clinical assistant in the Vanderbilt Clinic an professor of the practice of medicine in the Women's Medical College. For several years he has been attending physician of the City Hospital and Bellevue.

Dr. Lockwood, though seldom figuring in the public prints, built up a large practice and stands in the front rank of the specialists of the country. He constantly was in demand among persons who had stomach trouble. That in his sacrifices of time and energy to delve into science so he might ease human suffering he should be afflicted

with a disease of the stomach is regarded as another ironical incident of fate. He still is young in his practice, being only 50 years old. Gastric ulcers, it is explained, are of such an insidious nature they seldom are discovered until they have reached an acute stage and until hemorrhages begin.

Doctors explain many persons have ulcers of the stomach and intestines for months and are not aware of the malady. After eating there may be a pain, which seems trivial, but gradually the ulcer, if it fails to heal, eats away part of the lining of the stomach and the intestines.

Sir,

I have the honor to inform you that on the 20<sup>th</sup>, Ultimo, I addressed a communication to Brig. L. Thomas, Adjutant General, USA, requesting allowance of commutation for fuel and quarters while employed by a member of a Military Commission in session at Baltimore, Maryland.

I reply, I received a communication dated Jan. 12<sup>th</sup> 1865, signed R. Williams, Ass't. Adj. Genl. Informing me that my "application has not been favorably considered by the Secretary of War.

I respectfully request a reconsideration of any application, and ask leave to present the following reasons for granting any request.

On arriving in Baltimore in obedience to Special Orders, No. 283, War Department, for quarters and fuel for myself and servants, in accordance with Par. 1086. R. R. USA, and was informed that commutation would be allowed in lieu of quarters and fuel in kin. I therefore.

I have a large family residing in the city of Brooklyn, New York, dependant on me for support, and I have no other means of supporting them than my pay in the service, which affords only the bare necessities of life.

My disability for field service is now so far removed that I am about to apply to be relieved from duty here to return to my regiment in the field, and am under the necessity of purchasing a horse and horse equipment to take with me, my horse having been killed by the fall of a stable, and his equipment destroyed by the same accident and want of care during my absence; it therefore becomes necessary that I receive all that is due e by a fair interpretation of the Regulating and Orders of the War Department.

I have served the Government faithfully, to the best of my ability since the war began, in several grades of Private, Sergeant-Major, Captain and Major; participating in all the battles fought by the Army of the Potomac, from the battle of Bull Run, July 1861; to the battle of Chancellorsville in May 1863. I am not on my present duty from choice, but having become disqualified, for a time, for active field duty, through the hardships and exposure of some three years campaigning, was ordered on duty hear, since which time, I take pleasure in referring to the records of the proceeding of the Military Commission of which I am now a member and of the preceding it of which I was president, as evidence of my devotion to duty, about forty-five cases having been tried since the fifteenth of November last. For my antecedents, I respectfully refer you to Hon. James W. New York, US Senator elect for

Nevada; Hon. James Kelly, Post Master New York City; Geo. W. Erubree, Deputy Collector, Port of New York; John Keyser, Ex-Register, New York; Wm. R. Stewart, Supervisor, New York; and Samuel Sinclair of the New York Tribune.

For my reputation as a soldier, I refer you to every commanding officer, now surviving, under whom I have had the honor of serving.

While all classes of our citizens, including the Cowards and Traitors of the North who refuse to expose their worthless lives in defense of their nation's honor, are reveling in unexampled prosperity, I humbly and sincerely trust that my government, for which I have offered my life a willing sacrifice, if necessary, will not deprive me of the means of supplying my family with the bare necessities of life, by withholding any portion of the compensation prescribed by law, regulations and the usages of the service, and which I feel to be justly due.

Before a Military Commission which convened at Baltimore, Maryland, December 3, 1864, pursuant to Special Orders, No. 283, dated November 10, 1864; No. 288, dated November 16, 1864; No. 297, dated November 25, 1864, and No. 301, dated November 30, 1864, Headquarters Middle Department, 8<sup>th</sup> Army Corps, Baltimore, Maryland, and of which Major G. M. Dennett, 9<sup>th</sup> U. S. Colored Troops, is President, was arraigned and tried — Mrs. Margarette Barasha.

**Charge.** — “Assisting a United States soldier to desert”

Specification—”In this: that she, the said Margarette Barasla, did bring from New York city, New York, to Baltimore city, Maryland, a suit of citizens' clothes, and furnish the same to her brother, John Foley, a substitute in the army of the United States, knowing him to be such, to enable him to escape as a deserter from said army. All this at Baltimore, Maryland, on or about the 13th day of November, 1864.”

To which charge and specification the accused, Mrs. Margarette Birasha, pleaded “Not Guilty.”

**Finding.**

The Commission, having maturely considered the evidence adduced, finds the accused, Mrs. Margarette Barasha, as follows:

Of the Specification, “Guilty.”

Of the Charge, “Guilty.”

**Sentence.**

And the Commission does therefore sentence her, Mrs. Margarette Barasha, "To be imprisoned, at labor, for and during the period of two (2) years, to date from the day of sentence, (December 3, 1861,) at such as the Commanding General may designate."

II. -The findings and sentence of the Commission in the above case were approved by the proper commander, and the record forwarded for the action of the President of the United States.

The sentence is approved, and the Female Prison at Fitchburg, Massachusetts, designated as the place of confinement, where the prisoner, Mrs. Margarette Barasha, will be sent, under suitable guard, by orders of the Department Commander, for the execution of her sentence.

**Albion K. P. Dennett**, who for many years prior to his decease was one of the most influential citizens of Flushing, was born in Lyman, Me., August 9, 1827. The family has been identified with the history of Maine since the days of early pioneer settlements, when the first of the name in this country emigrated from England. Through succeeding generations agriculture has been the principal occupation of the family. They have been conspicuous for bravery in war and patriotism in civic affairs. Our subject's grandfather, Joseph Dennett, a native of Maine, was one of those brave men who endured hardships and braved obstacles seemingly insurmountable, in order to gain independence for the colonies. His services in the Revolutionary War entitle him to the respect of every patriot.

The father of our subject, Jesse Dennett, was born in Maine, and married Ann Hooper, also a native of that state. He followed agricultural operations for many years, and subsequently moved to New York City, where he engaged in the ice business with our subject. He died about 1858 at the home of his son. Of his children our subject was third in order of birth. He remained on the farm until he was about twenty-one, when he went to New York and became an employee of the Knickerbocker Ice Company\*\*, gradually working his way up until he became a stockholder in the concern. Later, locating in 31<sup>st</sup> Street, he engaged in the ice business on his own account.

Coming to Flushing in 1868, Mr. Dennett bought out John Willet's ice business and Kissena Lake, and afterward carried on a large trade in this locality. For some time he was trustee of the village and for two years was president of the board. While holding this position he was largely instrumental in introducing the water works in Flushing, and later served as supervisor of the town of Flushing for about three years. He was made a Mason in New York, and was long an active member of Cornucopia Lodge in Flushing, also belonged to Pentalpha Chapter. For years he was trustee and leader of the choir in the Baptist Church, and at the time of his demise held the position of president of the board of trustees. At the time of the erection of the church he was a member of the building committee. Several times he represented his party the Republican—as a delegate to county and state conventions. He was a member of the Twelfth Regiment of the New York National Guard and served as first lieutenant of his company, which was called to Washington for three months at the time of the war.

In New York Mr. Dennett married Miss Jane M. Smith, who was born in Rensselaer Co., N. Y., being a daughter of Ira and Lois (Allen) Smith, natives of Petersburg, that county. Her father, who was a farmer, died at the age of sixty-three; her mother, who was the daughter of William Allen, a farmer of Rensselaer Co., died there at the age of forty-seven. Of their five children, three are living, Mrs. Dennett being third in order of birth. Her childhood years were spent in Petersburg, and she was trained, under the wise counsel of her parents for the responsibilities which future years brought to her. A member of the Baptist Church, she is an active worker in the Ladies' Aid Society, and has taken a warm interest in all measures for the benefit of the denomination. Her only child, Grace D., is the wife of W. T. James, who is manager of the ice business established by Mr. Dennett.

The traits of character for which Mr. Dennett was especially distinguished were his generosity and integrity. No worthy person ever appealed in vain to him for aid, and the poor and the needy had in him a helpful friend, one who labored not only to relieve their temporary wants, but so to place them in a position where they might become self-supporting. As a citizen he was modest and retiring, and, although a man of firm convictions and educated judgment, never sought to control the opinions of others. Beautifying life by his example, he was the type of a citizen and business man who can be pointed to with pride as a representative.

Albion K. P. Dennett, of Flushing; in his sixty-fourth year. He was born in Lyman, Maine, August 9<sup>th</sup>, 1827, and was name in honor of the Governor of that State. He was of the old Revolutionary stock, his grandfather having had an honorable career in the American army during the war for Independence. When twenty-two years of age he went to New York City and was employed by the Knickerbocker Ice Company. Four years later he started in the ice business for himself in New York, an after fifteen years sold it out and went to Flushing, where he built up a large and profitable business, becoming the owner of Kissena Lake, back of the village, from which his ice crop was

mainly gathered. He was elected Supervisor of the town in 18779, against Hon. E. A. Lawrence, and held the office for several years afterward, defeating Joseph Dykes repeatedly. Mr. Dennett served during the Civil War, being among those who responded to President Lincoln's call for three month's men. He was a member of the Baptist Church and a consistent Christian.

**Victim of Chattahoochee Recovered at 8:30 AM, Four Miles from the City—Coroner Holds Inquest at Torbett's Morgue—Body Will Be Shipped to Maine for Interment--Had Been Missing Since 10<sup>th</sup> of the Month**

The Body of Harry Dennett, a machinist, from Portland, Maine, who met a tragic death by drowning in the Chattahoochee River, on the night of November 10<sup>th</sup>, was recovered about 8:30 o'clock this morning by E. L. Reese, who had been searching for the boy since its disappearance. The body was located about four miles from the city about seventy-five yards from the point where the victim fell into the water. It was in a good state of preservation, the cold water acted as a preservative. It was brought to the city and a coroner's investigation held in the undertaking parlors of C. Torbett. The verdict of the coroner's jury was to the effect that Dennett met his death by accidental drowning. The boy will be prepared for burial, and then shipped to Maine, where the interment will take place.

Mr. Dennett came to Columbus to superintend the installation of some machinery at one of the local manufacturing plants. In company with C. H. Bachellor, J. C. Wilkes, E. B. Blakwell, and W. A. Prince, he made a pleasure trip down the river, using a small craft belonging to Charlie Windham. Eye-witnesses to the drowning stated that Dennett was seated in a chair on top of the boat when he suddenly fell overboard. A search was immediately begun but was fruitless until this morning.

As soon as the news of the young man's death reached his home in Maine, instructions were sent to Columbus for the search to continue and for the body to be prepared for burial here and shipped to Maine. It is understood that the Secco Peddy Company, the firm for which Dennett traveled, bore the expenses of a vigorous search and exercised every other effort to locate the body and to relieve relatives of the victim from alarm. The interest taken evidences the high regard in which th(e) unfortunate young man was held by his employers.

It is not thought that any of the dead man's kinsmen will come to Columbus to accompany the boy to Maine, owing to the great distance and the time it would necessitate in getting here. However, the boy will be prepared and shipped from the Torbett morgue and the funeral held in the late home town in the North.

Funeral services for Frank Otis, former mayor of Alameda an one of the last two members of the first graduating class of the University of California, were held at 1 o'clock today at the Alameda Elks Club. The Elk's ritual for the dead was given, with Rev. Frank S. Brush, former pastor of the Alameda First Presbyterian Church, officiating. Interment was in the Otis family plot in Mountain View Cemetery. The body of the former mayor, who passed away at the Alameda Sanatorium on Thursday, lay in state today from 10 until 1 o'clock in the rotunda of the Alameda City Hall.

Honorary pallbearers at the funeral included Chief Justice Waste of the California Supreme Court, Al Latham, J. B. Lanktree, Mayor Ellsworth of Piedmont, President Sproul of the University of California, Joseph R. Knowland, Robert Sibley, secretary of the California Alumni Association; Charles W. Griffin, George E. Plummer, Major C. L. Tilden, A. W. Porter an Clarence J. Wetmore, last surviving member of the class of '73. Active pallbearers were member of the Alameda Elks Club.

In a statement yesterday concerning Mr. Otis' death, President Sproul of the University said: "The passing of Frank Otis destroys another link in the chain which binds the University to its beginnings. He was a member of the first class of 1873, which set the standard for all the classes to come. Personally, he exemplified the high degree the qualities of loyalty and service to home, to city and to the larger community that a state has a right to expect of the graduates of its University. We have been proud of Frank Otis living; we mourn him dead." Mr. Otis is survived by his widow, Mrs. Lucretia Otis, and by two sons, Edwin M. Otis of Alameda, and Stephen F. Otis, Sacramento attorney.

**Frank Otis** In many respects one of the most distinguished citizens of the East Bay district is Frank Otis, who has held the office of mayor of Alameda continuously since 1919, and whose record of public activities has made him one of the most favorably known men in this section of the state, while in the profession of law he has long been regarded as the peer of any of the members of the Alameda county bar.

Mr. Otis was born in San Francisco on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of November, 1852, and is a son of Stephen and Harriet (Dennett) Otis, who were pioneers of California, he having made the long journey around Cape Horn and she by way of Panama. He was reared in San Francisco, attending the grade and high schools, and then became a member of the first freshman class, to enter the University of California under that institution's medal awarded for the highest scholarship. Subsequently in 1876 the Master of Arts degree was conferred upon him. He then turned his attention to the law, studying under the preceptorship of Judge Selden S. Wright, and later of Edwin B. Mastick.

Mr. Otis was admitted to the bar in Sacramento, April 11, 1876, and became associated with the law firm of E. B. Possessing a keen and analytical mind, he has always been painstaking and thorough in the preparation of his cases and in the trial of causes has proven skillful and resourceful, while as an office counselor he has long been regarded as a sound and dependable advisor. In 1880 Mr. Otis was united in marriage to Miss Lucretia Lockwood Mastick, a daughter of his early associate, Edwin B. Mastick, and two sons born to this union are now living, namely, Edwin M., an attorney residing in Alameda and a former state senator, and Stephen F., an attorney in Sacramento. Mr. Otis began his public career as a member of the city board of education in 1899, serving eight years, during six of which he was president of the board. He was elected near the end of 1906 to the state assembly, representing Alameda county from 1907 to 1911.

While a member of the assembly, he sponsored in 1909 the well known anti-racetrack gambling bill which closed for gambling purposes the race-tracks of California. He likewise was the author of the certified milk bill which

initiated the procurement of pure milk by the people of this state. He was mayor of Alameda from 1913 to 1915, and was a member of the board of freeholders, also presiding over a later board which prepared the, city manager charter for Alameda.

In 1917 Mr. Otis was elected a member of the city council, serving in that capacity until 1919, when he was chosen mayor, and is now the incumbent of that position. During all the years of his residence here he has evinced the keenest interest in the welfare of his community, lending his efforts and his influence to its advancement and betterment along civic and moral lines. During the world war he worked actively in the furtherance of the various war measures. He headed the executive committee on all of the Liberty Loan drives in Alameda, each one of which exceeded the apportionment, and was an effective four-minute speaker.

Mr. Otis is a member of the Society of California Pioneers, the Commonwealth Club, the San Francisco Commercial Club, the Sierra Club, has served as head of the Unitarian Club of America and as a director of the Olympic Club and the Mercantile Association of San Francisco. He belongs to the Benevolent Protective Order of Elks and the Sons of the American Revolution, and is one of the charter members of the California Alpha of Phi Delta Theta, belonging also to the Golden Bear Society and the Phi Beta Kappa.

Mr. Otis has traveled widely, having visited practically all of the larger cities of the world, and in 1889-90 made a memorable trip of one hundred and thirty days on a clipper ship from San Francisco around Cape Horn to Liverpool. He is a man of vigorous and alert mentality, is remarkably well preserved physically, and, though advanced in years, is still young in his interests. His has been an active and useful life and no citizen of his community commands to a greater degree the confidence and esteem of the people.

On 04 Oct 1944, while helping the evacuation of wounded he was captured and interred in a German Prisoner of War Camp until the end of the war.
